The Rules about Your Trash

There have again been recent incidents of residents putting their trash and garbage out at their curbside days ahead of the regular Thursday pickup by Waste Management.

Village Ordinance 8-16-94 states that refuse is to be placed at the curbside **no sooner than the evening before scheduled collection.** The ordinance also provides for fines and other penalties to be imposed on those who violate the rules.

Control Your Grass Clippings

As you mow your lawn this season, remember to not leave your grass clippings in the street. Otherwise we can end up with clogged storm drains and time consuming and costly cleanout projects. This is the same as littering.



The Most Effective Mosquito Control

It turns out that the customary practice of fogging an area with insecticide is at best only minimally effective at controlling mosquito populations.

The best strategy is for each property owner to eliminate the conditions on their property where mosquito larvae can develop. That means eliminating stagnant water and damp conditions.

This is something that every resident and property owner can and should do. How? By eliminating standing water and damp conditions that provide the habitat for mosquito larva to develop. Examples of things to watch for that can hold stagnant water are buckets, flower pots, tarps, old tires, roof gutters that aren't draining, derelict cars, defunct swimming pools, piles of damp leaves, sheds with leaky roofs, and so forth.
