POOL

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. THERE HAVE BEEN CHANGES IN SOME PRICING AT THE POOL:
 - a. A FAMILY OF 6 SEASON PASS WILL GO FROM \$175 TO \$200.
- 2. b. POOL PARTIES UNDER 75, WILL CHANGE TO UNDER 50, FOR \$125. c. POOL PARTIES OVER 75, WILL CHANGE TO OVER 50, WILL COST \$175
- 3. EVENING SWIMMING TIMES 5 TILL 7 WILL COST \$2
- 4. IF WE WERE TO HAVE EVENING SWIMMING THE UNDERWATER LIGHTING WOULD HAVE TO BE REPAIRED. SALLY TOLD ANTHONY, TO CHECK THE COST OF SUCH REPAIRS.
- 5. DEPENDING ON AVAILABILITY OF LIFEGUARDS, EXTEND THE CLOSING OF THE POOL SEASON UNTIL AFTER THE LABOR DAY WEEKEND.
- 6. THERE WERE 10 LIFEGUARDS LAST SEASON. SEVERAL NEWCOMERS ARE INTERESTED IN ATTAINING THEIR CERTICATION FOR THE UPCOMING SEASON.
- 7. IF A STUDENT IS 15, THEY CAN BECOME A CERTIFIED LIFEGUARD.
- 8. IF A LIFEGUARD SUBMITS THE RECEIPTS FOR CERTIFICATION AND SWIMWEAR, THEY WILL BE REINBURSTED.
- 9. THE CERTIFICATION WILL TAKE PLACE AT THE YMCA AND PLEASNTVILLE
- 10.BUDGET AND FIANANCE SET ASIDE \$16,000 TO CONTINUE RENOVATIONS ON BOTH POOLS. A CONTRACTOR WILL BE HIRED TO FINISH THE CEMENT WORK IN AND AROUND THE BABY POOL. THE CONTRACTOR WILL CORRECT THE BOWING OF THE WALL ON THE NE SECTOR OF THE LARGE POOL.
- 11.AFTER REPAIRS ARE MADE IN THE POOL AREA, THE VILLAGE WORKERS WILL CLEAN ABD PAINT BOTH POOLS.

- 12.IT WILL BE UP TO THE NEW MANAGER WHETHER THE LIFEGUARDS PAINT THE RESTROOMS AND SURROUNDING DECKING.
- 13.THE POOL CLEAN-UP DAY WILL TAKE PLACE ON SATURDAY, MAY 20 THE RAIN DAY WILL BE SUNDAY, MAY 21.
- 14.LAST YEAR, THE VENDING MACHINES BROUGHT IN \$1,221.39. THE SAME VENDOR WILL RETURN THIS COMING SEASON.
- 15. A NEW LIFT CHAIR FOR THE HANDICAPPED WILL BE DECIDED ON BY ANTHONY AND SALLY.
- 16.SALLY WILL CONTACT THE NEW HEAD OF FOREST ROSE TO LET THEM KNOW THE BREMEN POOL HAS FACILITIES FOR THE HANDICAPPED.
- 17.THE PLANNING MEETING FOR THE POOL FUNDRAISER WILL MEET AT THE BREMEN LIBRARY AT 12 NOON ON SATURDAY, MARCH 5.
- 18.SALLY'S POOL FUND RAISER, "SPLASH INTO SUMMMER" WILL BE HELD SUNDAY, MAY 15 AT THE LANCASTER EAGLES ON EAST MAIN STREET, LANCASTER, OHIO. THE DOORS SWILL OPEN AT 12. ADMISSION IS \$20 PER PERSON. TWO BANDS," WHISKEY RVER AND BAD INFLUENCE" WILL START PLAYING 2HEN THE DOORS OPEN. FOOD WILL START BEING SERVED AT 2. THE THEMED GIFT BASKETS WILL BE RAFFLED OFF DURING THE AFTERNOON ACTIVITIES.
- 19.THE ANNUAL EASTER PARADE WILL BE ON SATURDAY, APRIL 9TH. THE PARADE WILL START AT 12.

PARK OLD BUSINESS:

1. DEE MOWRY, PRESIDENT OF THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE HAD AGREED ON PAYING THE BILL TO HAVE 12 UTILITY POLES ELECTRIFIED FOR CHRISTMAS WREATHS. SINCE MR. MOWRY IS NO LONGER PRESIDENT, THE BID NEEDS TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE NEW PRESIDENT, DAVE FOLTZ. THE VILLAGE NEEDS TO LIST ITEMS NEEDED, ALONG WITH COST OF EACH ITEM. LAST SUMMER, EACH FINISHED BOX COST WAS \$81.38, 12 BOXES WOULD HAVE COME TO \$976.56. SINCE PRICES HAVE RISEN, NEW PRICES ARE NEEDED. ONCE BILLING HAS BEEN SUBMITTED, AND OK'D, AEP CAN COME AND CONNECT THE ELECTRIC TO THE NEWLY MADE BOXES.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. THE NEW SECTON OF THE PLAYGROUND INSTALLATION HAS BEEN FINISHED.
- 2. MULCH WILL BE ORDERED ONCE ALL BILLING IS UPDATED.
- 3. THE NEW PORTION OF THE PLAYGROUND WILL NOT BE OPENED UNTIL THE PLAYHGROUND HAS BEEN MULCHED.
- 4. THE SIGN THAT WAS ON THE OIL DERRICK BUILDING WAS TAKEN DOWN AND STORED INSIDE THE BUILDING. MIKE QUALLS CAME DOWN AND GAVE AN ESTIMATE OF \$500 TO RESTORE THE TWO PANELS. EARL LEHMAN HAS DONATED \$250, AND DAVID AND DEBBIE WOLFE WILL DONATE THE OTHER \$250.
- 5. PROGRAMMABLE LED MESSAGE SIGNS NEED TO BE PURCHASED FOR THE CORNER OF MARIETTA STREET / STATE ROUTE 664, AND STATE ROUTES 664 AND 37. SALLY WILL TALK WITH MIKE QUALLS ABOUT THE COST OF THIS PROJECT.
- 6. SINCE THE TENNIS COURT IS IN SUCH DISREPAIR, IT WAS SUGGESTED THAT IT BE TAKEN OUT, AND REPLACED WITH A SOD COVERED DOG PARK.
- 7. GUESTS AT THE DOWLING PARK SUMMER CONCERTS SERIES WILL BE ABLE TO USE THE RESTROOM AT 136 MARITTA STREET.
